Visit to Océanpolis and 70.8 Museum

DebConf 25 Day Trip - Option C

This day trip option encompasses visiting two different ocean-related centres: Océanopolis and 70.8 Museum. Océanopolis is not just an aquarium, it is a national centre for scientific culture dedicated to the ocean. It is involved in various marine biodiversity conservation programmes for corals, tropical fish and marine mammals. Océanopolis is situated near the Moulin Blanc beach and its marina, at the East entrance to Brest's harbor.

On the other hand, the 70.8 Museum is located in the heart of the Ateliers des Capucins in Brest. The 70.8 Museum offers around $1,000\,\mathrm{m}^2$ of interactive exhibitions on marine observation, sea resources, deep-sea exploration, maritime transport, navigation, climate, energy and many other issues related to the ocean. The different topics are discussed for all audiences.



Food and basics

- No food will be provided by the organization team during the visit
- Participants who have conference-provided meals will receive a **sandwich lunch** before departure, in the venue, to be carried by the participants.
- Everyone is responsible for bringing their own water and any additional snacks or items they may need for the picnic.
- There is a specially rented coach that will take participants to Océanpolis. After that, for **getting to the 70.8 Museum**, and for **returning to the venue**, we plan to use public transportation (bibus).

We strongly suggest that participants make use of their bibus congress pass ticket, that will be provided upon arrival to the conference.

• It is strictly forbidden to carry knives inside the museums. Luggage will be checked by venue security.
